Subject: Brake Shoe Surcharge

Railroad Friction Products Corporation has recently experienced unprecedented cost increases for raw materials used in the manufacture of brake shoes. Steel and oil have been the driving forces behind these raw material cost fluctuations. These unprecedented cost increases have forced Railroad Friction Products Corporation to introduce new list prices that are comprised of a base price, as well as a surcharge established from steel and oil indexes.

The surcharge amount will increase/decrease based on the NYMEX sweet crude oil barrel price – WTI, Cushing, OK and the American Metal Market (AMM) Steel Base Prices-Sheets-Hot Rolled price per pound. Surcharges are calculated using the base prices for steel, hot rolled sheet, at a level of \$0.265 per pound and a sweet crude oil level of \$90 per barrel.

For example:

March 2010 surcharge:

V472, 1.5" Freight High Friction Brake Shoe	\$0.08
V474, 2.0" Freight High Friction Brake Shoe	\$0.08
V624, 2.0" DayOne™ TreadGuard® Freight Brake Shoe	\$0.13

Railroad Friction Products Corporation will use values obtained on the first of the month to establish a surcharge that will become effective the first of the following month. For example, values obtained February 1, 2010 were used to calculate the surcharge that will be effective March 1, 2010. The surcharges will be adjusted monthly and published in the announcements section of our website, www.rfpc.com, during the first week of each month.
